

Tower of Babel

Material

- 9 cardboard rolls
- 2 brown pieces of paper
- 1 white piece of paper
- Water paint (or any other kind of paint)
- Brushes, paint sponges
- Glue
- Transparent sticky tape

Preparation

Start with cutting 2 circles from the brown pieces of paper. One needs to be slightly bigger than the other.

Making the Craft

Your child can begin with painting the 'ground' on the white piece of paper. We focused on a mix of earthy colours, but it can be any colour, really.

Once the paint has dried, your child can start building the tower. Our base existed of 5 cardboard rolls stuck together with glue and tape. Then I added it to the painted base.

I tried to do this with glue, but I noticed that the water paint had made the paper a little wavy. As such, the glue didn't allow the rolls to stick on it as well. I then added some sticky tape to the inside of the rolls.

When the foundation of the tower is created, your child can stick the largest circle on the top. From there, simply add the next 3 rolls followed by the smallest circle and one more roll.

Then your tower of Babel is completed!
